

U.S. Tariff Monthly Report — September 2026

September in one line: 27 FR notices tracked, including 2 substantive Section 232 actions (polysilicon anti-stockpiling weekly caps; a new zero-rate pharma heading), and 2 Section 338 scope adjustments on Canadian goods (effective 2026-09-15). From 2026-10-01, the Q4 customs underpayment interest rate is 7% and the FY2027 raw cane sugar supplementary TRQ allocation of 55,993 MTRV becomes enterable.

The three actions most likely to matter to cross-border sellers:

- Polysilicon Section 232 anti-stockpiling temporary final rule** (91 FR 60505): weekly import volume caps for new importers of record, with entry bans for over-cap importers, in effect through **2026-12-04**.
- Section 232 pharmaceutical implementation guidance** (91 FR 60360): new heading **9903.04.70** applies "otherwise-applicable rate + 0%" to pharmaceutical articles and associated ingredients used solely for clinical trials, R&D, or other non-commercial applications.
- Section 338 scope changes on Canadian goods** (Proclamations 11064/11065): the 50% additional-duty lists for motor vehicles (8701–8705) and alcoholic beverages (2203–2208) were modified, effective **2026-09-15 12:01 ET**.

2. Deep Dives

2.1 Polysilicon anti-stockpiling: weekly caps for new importers (91 FR 60505)

To support the polysilicon measures in Proclamation 11052, BIS issued a temporary final rule: **new importers of record** (those without prior entries of the covered goods) face weekly volume caps, and are barred from further entries once over cap. Existing importers of record found by Commerce to be stockpiling can be barred from entering covered goods through 2026-12-04 (waivers available).

Why it matters for solar supply chains: the rule targets front-running of the tariff schedule by new entrants and stockpiling by incumbents. Importers of modules and cells who were planning to shift volume to a fresh importer-of-record should reassess compliance risk. This is a temporary final rule in effect through **2026-12-04** and may be amended or extended — track it via the [Tariff Radar](#).

2.2 Section 232 pharma guidance: zero-rate heading 9903.04.70 (91 FR 60360)

Presidential Proclamation 11020 (April 2, 2026) imposed a 100% additional tariff on pharmaceuticals; this BIS guidance implements it and opens a zero-rate lane for non-commercial use. Four changes:

Why it matters for pharma and API importers: the landed-cost math for R&D samples and clinical-trial articles changes — entry under 9903.04.70 avoids the 100% additional tariff, but "solely for non-commercial use" is exactly where scrutiny lands. Prepare the entry narrative and documentation before relying on it.

2.3 Canada 50% additional-duty scope changes, effective 2026-09-15 (Proclamations 11064/11065)

Two proclamations revised the scope of the 50% additional duties on Canadian products, both effective **2026-09-15 12:01 ET**:

- **Motor vehicles** (Proclamation 11065, 91 FR 58339): products listed in Proclamation 11048 Annex II moved into scope (Annex I Part A) or out of scope (Annex I Part B); adjustments sit within chapters 8701–8705.
- **Alcoholic beverages** (Proclamation 11064, 91 FR 58331): the same Part A/Part B treatment applied to Proclamation 11046, within chapters 2203–2206/2208.

Caution: the annexes are published as images — verify individual classifications against the annex tables. Canada-bound shippers and North America lane forwarders should re-check affected entries line by line.

How to read this: a 7% underpayment rate makes carrying disputed duty balances into Q4 expensive — worth resolving before October. Quota-dependent categories (sugar, dairy) switch to the new quota year's numbers on October 1.

4. Section 337 IP Actions: 7 This Month

Mostly procedural, but two deserve attention from electronics and mother-and-baby sellers:

- **DDR5 DRAM investigation instituted (337-TA-1523):** Netlist vs. Micron, HPE, Lenovo, Supermicro. The accused products cover DDR5-generation DIMM modules **and servers, computing systems and**

storage systems containing them. ITC exclusion orders routinely reach downstream products containing infringing components — server and system importers should track this one. Source: [FR 2026-19697](#)

- **General exclusion order issued (337-TA-1453):** final determination finding a Section 337 violation for certain boiler protection for absorption refrigeration systems, with a **GEO** barring imports of the products and components regardless of manufacturer. Source: [FR 2026-19543](#)
- Also this month: wearable breast pumps instituted (337-TA-1522, Willow Innovations); flash-spun nonwoven materials (TYVEK case, 337-TA-1424) review-in-part; balloon dilation devices (337-TA-1449) review-in-part with target date extended to 2026-11-13; glow fish tape/safety helmet systems (337-TA-1442) review-in-part; electronic devices with audio technologies instituted (337-TA-1521, BoomCloud 360).

5. Procedural and Process Notices

- **CBP ANPRM on heightened import disclosures** (19 CFR 141/142/143/163, implementing E.O. 14411 "Strengthening Customs Enforcement"): proposed increased import-disclosure requirements, **comments due 2026-12-01**. A leading indicator of future compliance costs — forwarders and compliance teams should start assessing now. Source: [FR 2026-17926](#)
- **ACE Electronic Export Manifest (EEM) for Truck Cargo test:** voluntary participation begins 2026-10-23. Source: [FR 2026-19414](#)
- **USITC request for comments on Section 338(g) implementation:** comments due 2026-11-09 — Section 338 is the statutory basis for the current Canada additional duties. Source: [FR 2026-18385](#)
- Otherwise: 3 CBP commercial gauger/laboratory approvals (Bennett Testing, Saybolt ×2); PRA revision notice on used self-propelled vehicle exportation; PRA extension request for sugar TRQ certificates of quota eligibility; SEC proposal to rescind the investment-adviser pay-to-play rule; FDIC bank-merger processing reform proposal; PHMSA preemption determination on New Jersey tort claims (none HTS-related).
